What is this "Portal" thing?

The management company, Midtowne, has encourage residents with internet access to use a tool they provide on line. The word sounds like something out of Star Trek, but it is far less dramatic. Called a Portal, it enables each of us to interact quickly and conveniently with Midtowne staff. You can submit maintenance requests, arrange for monthly association dues payments, and much more. Please contact Anna in her office at the Clubhouse and she will be happy to help you set up your access to the Portal.

New poolside furniture and repairs to the pool

Our pool is the favorite amenity here. To make your outdoor and swimming experience more enjoyable, the board has purchased eight new chaise lounges for poolside. Also, Midtowne Realty has donated two round concrete tables with built-in benches and umbrellas

Eric Fisher, at Midtowne, has reported that the winter has been hard on the pool. About sixty pool tiles must be replaced. Some of the water filtration equipment is not working properly. Hopefully, the work will be complete in time for the traditional opening on Memorial Day weekend.

Plumbing inspections and repairs are underway

As part of the effort to wrestle our water bills into a manageable level, we are conducting inspections of every unit's plumbing. We are looking for water leaks needing some TLC. Any units needing plumbing repairs can have the work done by Midtowne at the owner's expense or contact your own preferred plumber. The inspections are going floor by floor on a weekly basis.

Because of the way the building was built, the HOA pays the water bill here. And the cost of water has sky rocked in recent months. What may seem a small drip has impact. A frustratingly running toilet can cost several hundred dollars a month.

This isn't glamorous, but it is important work. The HOA and management are grateful for the generous cooperation of home owners as we schedule inspections. We all will be happy when the water bills are reduced and each unit's water pipes and systems are in good repair. The payoff will be in reduced water bills for the complex.

Have you learned about the "REAL ID" program?

Beginning in October 2020, a new formatted identification program will go into effect. This "REAL ID" driver's license, permit, or ID card will be required to board commercial airplanes or enter certain federal facilities.

In order to make your driver's license or other identification compliant with the law, individuals will be required to present documentation to establish one's identity. A long list of possible documents includes a current US or foreign passport, a certificate of naturalization, a birth certificate, or other documents

You can take all this information to your BMV branch anytime, to upgrade your license or ID to a "REAL ID."

Details, details

Your HOA Board is hoping to have a board member present in the Clubhouse on a regular schedule to take your comments, complaints, and compliments. This will, it is hoped, free Anna to focus on her desk work and give you one of the board members undivided attention.

In the laundry rooms, we hope to install some motion-sensitive light switches. This investment will help conserve energy. In the meantime, thank you for remembering to turn out the lights when you leave the laundry room.

Dumpsters are for trash only. Please do not use them to dispose of furniture. If useful to someone else, there are agencies in town who will be glad to have your old pieces. And construction materials should be removed by your contractor or yourself and not placed in the dumpsters.

Windows in our buildings are to be either brown or unpainted aluminum. No other colors have been authorized. Also, our rules state that window covering must be either blinds or curtains. Do not use sheets, blankets, towels, newspapers or other items to cover your windows.

New windows you want to install are to be approved by the board.

Dog-care stations. You may have already seen the new stations installed recently which provide small bags for dog droppings and a receptacle in which to put them. This improvement is very welcome and adds a touch of class—if a poop station can said to have class.

Road construction resumes



With warmer weather the street construction teams are busy again. You have already found that portions of North Clinton

have lane reductions that will continue for a while. Access to Grove Street is restricted and sometimes closed.

Along State Boulevard, the crumbling abutment just west of Westbrook, has been demolished. What for years looked like the remains of a war zone have spoiled an otherwise lovely portion of State. Changes are coming!

The old railroad right-of-way is being transformed into sections of the Pufferbelly Trail. New abutments will be installed, and once the State Boulevard road work is completed, a pedestrian bridge will be erected, allowing Pufferbelly Trail users to cross the busy street in complete safety.

Along with the abutments, the old bridge across Spy Run Creek will be removed and replaced with a new span. It will be higher above the water (reducing the possibility of impeding the flow of water), and bigger, to accommodate the additional lanes of traffic.

Be prepared to experience road closures and re-routings for your car trips and allow yourself extra travel time.
